

## Tax Return Identity Theft Resources:

If you have filed a tax return and are informed that one has already been filed in your name, you most likely have become a victim of Tax Return Identity Theft. The following are steps you can take to report the incident:

- You should also report the incident to the Federal Trade Commission by visiting ftc.gov for assistance with creating an identity theft report, and placing a fraud alert on their credit report. The following are useful links:
